Please, obtain your FAA Medical Certificate, <u>as soon as possible</u>, to ensure that your entire training process be efficient.

It may prevent you (or delay) from obtaining a FAA Medical Certificate if you have or think you have any of the following conditions: Heart Disease/Heart Attack; High Blood Pressure; Turberculosis or other Lung Disease; Allergies; Asthma; Diabetes; Cancer; Hearing Trouble; Fainting spells; Convulsions; Epilepsy; Ulcers; Psychiatric Treatment; Amputation of any part of the body; Frequent Headaches; Dizziness; Colorblindness; You presently under care of a physician.

How to Obtain FAA Medical Certificate:

1.) Call and make an appointment with an FAA certified Medical Examiner.

2.) On the phone, say the following, please:
